Directions to the Vinings Club are as follows:

Proceeding West on the northern arc of I-285: You will cross over I-75 and Hwy. 41.

Take the next exit (No. 18) which is the Vinings exit. At the end of the exit ramp, turn left (south)

on Paces Ferry Road.

Continue for six-tenths of a mile to Overlook Parkway (just past Wyndham Hotel).

Turn left onto Overlook Parkway and continue to second driveway on right.

Turn right into Overlook III (entrance to Vinings Club is in the building on the immediate right after turning).

After turning into Overlook III, continue straight ahead into the parking garage and take the first left in the garage. Park in the spaces marked for "valet" since there will not be valet parking. Enter building and walk past the elevators on the left and right and look for a small sign on left which says "Vinings Club".

Elevators to the Vinings Club are around the corner to the left. Take elevator down to the Vinings Club which is on Level 2 (marked on elevator button).

To Enter Vinings Club directly from parking garage without going outside: Take the garage elevator to the lobby level and proceed directly into the building

When you reach the elevators in the building, look for signs to the Vinings Club.

Do not take the main lobby elevators-they do not take you to the Vinings Club.

The elevator to the Vinings Club is just around the corner from the main elevators.


