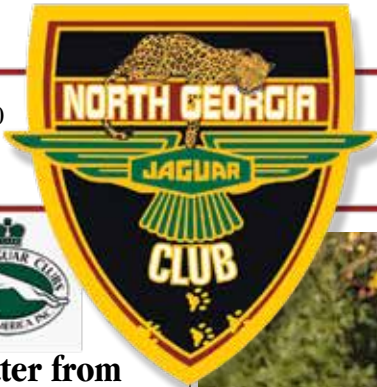

guy; and probably someone that I had never heard of. I was stumped but assured that McPherson was pumping out enough highly trained restorers to keep British classics on the road for the foreseeable future.

When I arrived at the check-in gate at the Port Royal Golf Course, I picked up my registration packet. I was assigned a show position that was at the end of a long row of cars where few people would see my Jag. The guy across from me had built his own one-seater race car that he had pushed to 221 mph. The featured marques were German cars.

Two Club members were Judges: Kirkman and Ivan Ruiz. In the HH Official Program, Kirkman's "Fun Fact" was that he drove a Lotus Europa over the Great Saint Bernard Pass from France into Italy in 1971. Ivan was noted in the Official Program as having owned and restored over 100 Jaguar E-Types and 80 Maserati's. He showed his 1978 Maserati Khamzin. John Yates exhibited his 1959 Jaguar XK150 DHC.

I was shocked when one of the judges came up to me and said I'd won an award. I replied there must be some mistake because my Jag was just a driver, not a show car. He insisted that I get in line behind a row of cars that were headed to the judges' stand. As I was driving along at 5mph, I noticed what appeared to be steam coming out of the bonnet. When I got to the judges' stand, I learned that I had won Best Overall British Car. I also saw that the needle on my water temperature was at the maximum; the car was severely overheated. I limped back to my assigned spot and popped open the bonnet. I could smell coolant and saw coolant was leaking from the--what I later learned--was the heater valve. I sent a photo of the leaking part to Dick Maury who told me the heater valve broke. The car couldn't be driven.

After some contentious discussion, I agreed to have my car towed by a golf cart to the asphalt parking lot. I pondered whether to wait until Monday to find a local mechanic who could replace the broken heater valve. But that would mean that the part would have to be ordered and by the time it arrived and was replaced, I would probably spend another three to five days in Hilton Head. I considered having the car towed back to Johns Creek. My phone was almost out-of-charge. I called Hagerty, but the representative wasn't helpful! I learned I was only covered for up to 100 miles. What would I have to pay out-of-pocket? It turned out the additional 160 miles or so would cost over \$2,000!!! Thanks, but NO THANKS!!!

Kirkman recommended Dr. Mike Mueller, who knows everything about Jaguars, as someone who might be

wouldn't pop open. He refilled the radiator with fresh coolant. I drove cautiously back to the hotel.

I had intended to stay for the Concours show on Sunday. I decided it would be more prudent to head back to Atlanta on Sunday morning, since I didn't know if the hose clamps would hold if I hit a pothole or had to make a sudden stop. I drove fairly slowly in third gear the whole way home. I checked the temperature gauge at least once a minute, looking for any sign of leaking coolant. Fortunately, the clamps held, the temperature gauge stayed in the normal range, and everything else went smoothly. It took me about seven hours, but I arrived home safe and sound before dinner time.

I called Dick the next day. He had a new spare heater valve in stock. I drove to his garage. He installed it on the same day! All's well that ends well.

I later learned that Mike Mueller co-authored "Jaguar E-Type Six Cylinder Originality Guide", undoubtedly the definitive work for Jaguar concours judges. Mueller's treatise is at the top of my Christmas wish list. As an aside, Mike's 1956 Jaguar XK 140 took second place in his class to a Jaguar that he had restored, commonly known as the Hussein (as is King Hussein) car.

I learned a lot of valuable life lessons:

- 1) always carry necessary tools, such as wrenches, screwdrivers, hammer, pliers, tape, and plastic ties;
- 2) don't be afraid to ask for help;
- 3) keep you cell phone charged up;
- 4) if it's British, it will break down, leak oil, and possibly leak other vital fluids;
- 5) losing all my coolant while driving slowly to receive an award was a blessing in disguise, contrasted with losing coolant on a highway and needing a new engine;
- 6) carry Griots;
- 7) carry spare parts; and
- 8) never underestimate the kindness of strangers.

Half of life is just showing up! Since British cars weren't featured, there were only a few on the show field. I won an award simply because I showed up when most other competitors didn't. Will I return to Hilton Head next year? Definitely! Everyone was so patient, understanding and helpful. It was an incredible show, and I was honored to be a small part of it.

Jaguar Boss Defends New Rebrand After Ad Airs Featuring Man In A Dress, Androgynous Models

The Jaguar Land Rover managing director is defending the British luxury car company after its recent rebranding spurred backlash on social media.

Jaguar debuted its new logo and slogan, "Copy Nothing," in a promotional video last week.

The ad featured androgynous models in brightly colored, over-the-top outfits, including one man wearing a dress, along with other slogans such as "create exuberant," "live vivid," "delete ordinary" and "break moulds." Notably, the ad did not feature any cars in its 30-second run. The video blew up on social media, attracting over 163 million views and over 100,000 comments.

Critics accused Jaguar of abandoning its legacy as a high-performance sports car manufacturer with the marketing campaign and claimed the brand had gone "woke."

In a recent interview with the Financial Times, Jaguar Land Rover managing director Rawdon Glover defended the brand relaunch and denied the ad was meant to send a "woke" message.

While Glover praised the attention around the campaign as "very positive," he said he was disappointed by the "level of vile hatred and intolerance" shown by social media commentators towards the models in the video.

He claimed the ad's message had been lost "in a blaze of



intolerance."

"If we play in the same way that everybody else does, we'll just get drowned out. So we shouldn't turn up like an auto brand," Glover told the FT.

"We need to re-establish our brand and at a completely different price point so we need to act differently. We wanted to move away from traditional automotive stereotypes."

The Jaguar rebrand is part of the company's efforts to attract wealthier customers in its transition to an all-electric vehicle lineup.

"This is not a depiction of how we think our future customers are," Glover told the

FT. "We don't want to necessarily leave all of our customers behind. But we do need to attract a new customer base."

Jaguar previously defended the company's brand relaunch in a statement to Fox News Digital.

"Our brand relaunch for Jaguar is a bold and imaginative reinvention and as expected it has attracted attention and debate. As proud custodians at such a remarkable point in Jaguar's history we have preserved iconic symbols while taking a dramatic leap forward. The brand reveal is only the first step in this exciting new era and we look forward to sharing more on Jaguar's transformation in the coming days and weeks," the statement said.

Austin Powers's Groovy 'Shaguar' E-Type Is Heading to Auction in January

The Union Jack-adorned roadster appeared in all three of the comedy blockbusters.

Are you still quoting a certain spy movie nearly three decades after it hit theaters? Well, have we got the car for you.

The "Shaguar" Jaguar E-Type Series I from the Austin Powers movies will be put up for bid by Mecum Auctions at its 2025 Kissimmee sale in January. The roadster isn't just a spirited replica, either—it's the actual vehicle Mike Myers drove in all three entries in the trio of comedy blockbusters.

It's lost most of its cultural cache over the years, but the Austin Powers movies were a pretty big deal around the turn of the millennium. The trio of spoofs—which starred Myers as the titular hero and his arch nemesis, Dr. Evil—poked fun at the British spy movies of the Swinging Sixties, and their frequently non-sensical plots, colorful clothes, and near-constant sexual innuendo.

Few things better represent the last of those tropes than Shaguar, a 1967 E-Type that the spy had fixed up with a Union Jack paint job and comedic sex-themed details. Although they'd make over \$675 million at the box office, the three Austin Powers movies (1997's *International Man of Mystery*, 1999's *The Spy Who Shagged Me* and 2002's *Goldmember*) were made relatively cheaply so only one example of the colorful sports car was used during the filming of all three. And it's this car that's headed to auction.

The roadster looks the same today as it did when it appeared in the movie series and the music video for Madonna's "Beautiful Stranger." It still wears the distinctive tri-color paint job and has beautiful chrome details, including "Shaguar" branding across the rear

deck lid. The interior has the steering wheel on the right side—it was owned by a British spy after all—and is covered in blue leather.

Later E-Types may have featured V-12 engines, but the Shaguar has a 4.2-liter inline-six connected to a four-speed manual. No output is listed, but when it was brand new the engine could make 265 horses, which was enough to push the car from zero to 60 mph in under seven seconds and to a top speed of 150 mph. The car, which has spent the last 22 years in a private collection, was restored by Jaguar Land Rover in the mid-aughts and looks to be in pretty decent shape.

The Shaguar is set to go up for bid on Saturday,



January 18. No estimate has been announced, but we imagine there will be interest in the E-Type. At the very least it seems certain to sell for significantly more than the \$55,000 the car's less famous peers frequently attract on the open market.

325.00. We have been consistent with our financial position. We determined that the club events essentially pay for themselves.

We should have ~ \$17K - \$19K on hand going forward. Approximately \$800.00 in checks to JCNA have not been cashed by the organization. We have looked into this and have not been able to determine what the issue could be. Additionally, JCNA is unable to locate the checks.

We have put a stop payment on the lost checks. This has cost NGJC \$210.00.

We may look at electronic payment options (Venmo, Zelle etc.) in lieu of checks.

NGJC dues will be \$65.00 per member. Of this, \$55.00 goes to JCNA, who raised their rates from \$45.00 to the current \$55.00 level. This does impact our reserves as a larger percentage of the dues goes to JCNA.

For payments through the website, for members who have paid for the Christmas party and the annual club dues in one lump payment, can we separate them to clarify membership status. John Baxa – Yes, we can.

Membership – John Baxa

Our membership dropped slightly to ~123 members. This includes the five new members that signed up this year since October 1st through 2025.

Per JCNA, individuals who sign up for the club during the 4th quarter of the year pay a total of \$65.00, this covers the balance of the current year plus the following years dues

Under 25-year-old membership dues are approximately \$30.00. We do not have anyone that falls into this category.

We have to turn our roster in to JCNA at the end of January.

The board discussed plans for growing the member base.

Craig Gustin recommended developing membership campaigns. Can we work with dealerships to provide savings opportunities for members that use their services? Craig will look into this.

parking for cars that are being trailered to the event.
